
# Announcing the SIF Essay Contest!



Stocks in the Future will be hosting an essay contest in April. This is a great chance to show off your ideas and writing skills. The essays will describe the valuable lessons students have


learned through their participation in SIF. The first prize winner will receive a \$50 savings bond, and there will be second and third place prizes as well!
